1. APPROVAL OF THE AGENDA:

2. <u>APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES:</u> - there were no Minutes for approval at this time.

3. BUSINESS:

- (a) CBT Funding (Discussion with Public Works)
 - Public Works Foreman, Leonard Casley, indicated that CBT is willing to put in another \$10,000 toward the Water Smart Program if the Village dedicates \$5,000 to the project. This would mean an additional \$15,000 on top of the \$15,000 already dedicated to the program, totalling \$30,000. Funding will be used for a system upgrade for controls.

101/2014 - Moved, seconded that Council proceed with the Water Smart Program as outlined by the Public Works Foreman and that staff prepare a budget amendment to enable this.

(b) Gallery Building (Architect)

- \$12,000 was reallocated from the Community Development grant funding that had been set out for a portion of the 2014 Capital Priorities in order to fund the cost of the architect.
- Councillor Clarke spoke with Gerald W. Stewart of GW Steward Architect Inc. out of Prince George regarding a quote, Mr. Stewart indicated that his costs would be more than the \$12,000 allocated to fund the project. Councillor Clarke asked if he would be willing to look over the proposal from Fairbank Architects for an opinion. Mr. Steward said he would be happy to assist.
